# Meeting Notice, April 10, 2013 Judy Soprano, Still life in Oil

Here she is folks, in my humble opinion and from personal experience, the best teacher and artist combination in this area. Most of us know Judy, so you know what to expect. Listen, watch and learn from this award winning artist who is adept in both watercolor and oil. She will be setting up and painting a still life composition in oils.

Here is a little history. Judy Soprano's warm and down-to-earth personality is what you might expect from someone raised on a farm. She was born in Rochester's 10th Ward, but grew up among the fields and woods of Hamlin. "I loved our barn...it was my castle, my Tarzan swing. Shadows on snow and bare trees are my next love. "Trees without leaves show their beauty." Judy says her childhood, observing and experiencing nature, was perfect training for an artist. For many years it was her only training. Her mother, a native of museum-rich New York City, worried about cultural deprivation because the family was so far from Rochester's museums. Her father, who farmed and worked on the railroad, insisted his children study practical subjects.

Judy graduated from Nazareth Academy and then got a job. But she soon married and had four children in four years; the fifth child came along nine years later. In the mid '70s, when her children were teen-agers, Judy studied in the fine arts program at the State University of New York at Brockport and numerous workshops with

nationally known teachers.

Judy still stays active in the Finger Lakes art community by teaching and belonging to such organizations such as the Central New York Watercolor Society, Rochester Art Club, Genesee Valley Plein Air Painters, and the Suburban Rochester Art Group.

Today, the warmth of Judy's paintings can be seen all along the east coast, from Upstate New York, to Florida. Her work has been called "scenic poetry", with landscape scenes including barns, trees, and other picturesque views. She implements unique but clever use of shadows in her paintings.

She has been quoted saying, "I opened the door to creativity and found my soul."

Artist <u>registrations</u> are now being accepted for the 2013 Plein Air Festival. Please fill out the registration form and send it snail mail with your non-refundable entry fee made payable to the Morristown Public Library, 200 Main St., Morristown, NY 13664 by June 1st. If you work in more than one media please excuse our oversight on the registration form and circle as many that apply. Upon receiving your registration form and entry fee of \$20 the library will ask you to electronically send a brief biography and photographs of your prior work in order to promote your attendance. This year's event will begin at 10a.m. Thursday, August 1st and end Sunday, August 4th with a Silent Auction and Reception.

All work must be delivered to The Pony Barn, 2908 SH 37, Brier Hill, NY by 10:00 a.m. on Sunday, August 4th. Framing is not required but work must be ready to hang with wire, no sawtooth hangers will be accepted. Artists may submit up to 3 pieces painted during the event. All entries must be identified by artist, title, media and opening bid on the label. The Silent Auction will open to the public at 6:00 p.m. with awards presented at 7:00 p.m.

All work will be judged. Prizes for 1st, 2nd, 3rd, People's Choice and Artist's Choice will be awarded. We are very pleased to announce this year's judge as <u>John Morrow</u>.

<u>June 1st:</u> Entry Deadline. Registrations postmarked after June 1st will be \$5 more <u>Thursday, August 1st:</u> artists arrive in Morristown, NY, pick up an event packet and have canvases stamped at the Morristown Public Library, 200 Main St., between 10:00 a.m. and 5:00 p.m. Begin painting.

Maps will be provided with over 25 approved painting sites. "Approved painting site" means that the festival committee has received permission from the owner of the property for you to be there. You are free to make your own arrangements as the only restriction to painting sites is a 7 mile radius to Morristown.

**Friday, August 2nd**: Artists paint. At 8:00 p.m. Joe McDonald will lecture on <u>Charles Chapman</u> and show his private collection at the library, 200 Main St.. Gloria Scott-Johnson will also show her private <u>Chapman</u> collection. Refreshments.

<u>Saturday, August 3rd:</u> Artists paint. At 6:00 p.m. the public is invited to a *Meet the Artists Chicken BBQ* at the Morristown Fire and Rescue Pavilion, 6703 Morris St., Morristown. Price is \$8 for each adult meal ticket purchased in advance, and \$10 at the door. **Each artist should bring a few of their previous works to display to the public**. Family entertainment will be provided at 7:00 p.m. by Juggling Josh.

<u>Sunday, August 4th</u>: Artists drop off up to 3 paintings to <u>Lauren Gilmour, curator</u> at the Pony Barn, 2908 SH 37, Brier Hill, NY at 10:00 a.m. Judging will begin at noon. Silent Auction and Reception.
